Why do we care for creation?

At St John's we are committed to the care of creation. We are happy to be building our relationship with the High Legh Climate Change and Environment Group and have recently become one of the 'allies' supporting Plastic Free High Legh. Seeing the effects of climate change, we know there is an increasing urgency for us to change the way we live. But as well as being persuaded by the evidence, it is already part of our Christian lives to care for creation.


God created a world he saw as 'verv good' and gave humanity dominion over it (Genesis 1). Misunderstanding dominion as domination is partly why we are where we are now, as humanity took what they wanted, often oppressing and destroying as they went. The dominion that God meant would be a rule that was in line with who God is: a God who loves us and all that he has made. In Micah we read that God requires us to 'act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God' (Micah 6:8). What would this look like in relation to our use of the earth? It would be a dominion which cares for the world - stewardship rather than domination.

As humans we value creation for all its beauty. Being out in nature is necessary for our well-being. We value what the earth gives us for food and for raw materials to make things. But this can become a purely human-centred view of the earth for our use.

Can we learn from how God values the world? At the end of the book of Job God uses creation to put Job's questions in a new context. God does not give a human-centred account of creation, but of his love for all of it. God values creation and therefore we value this earth he made because he does. If we remove ourselves from the centre and put God there, we develop an ethical approach to the whole world which includes us as fellow creatures, and this will affect how we live.

You are very welcome to join us as we think about our care of creation at Café Church on Sunday 27^h August and in our All-Age service on Sunday 3rd September.

What is GraveTalk?

For those with big questions about death, dying and funerals, having someone to talk to can be invaluable. But how do you start those conversations, and with whom? St Johns Church is starting a group in a café style environment to have 'conversations' with each other. This 'conversation' is also for younger people as well as older people, it is to talk about planning, most of us put this to one side and choose not to think about it.

Grave talk is a conversation NOT a training session. People find that once they start talking, there is a lot to be said about this sensitive but important reality.

We plan to run it over 2 sessions; time and dates to be confirmed. It will be very relaxed. It's about planning. This is open to everyone in the community.

At the foot of the Matterhorn Mountain in Switzerland lies the town of Zermatt, where an area of the church cemeterv has been dedicated to climbers who have lost their lives whilst climbing the forbidding "Matterhorn."

Their gravestones reflect the decades of their intrepid passion for mountaineering. On one hung the climber's boots, on others sculptures of their equipment, the fearless mountain eagle, stone effigies of the climbers, their dates over two centuries and their world-wide nationalities

The two most poignant to me were the sculpture of the Matterhorn dedicated to "the grave of the unknown climber" and the New-Yorker whose epitaph read, " O

FREITHORN I CHOSE TO CLIMB."




