REFLECTION ON THE READING

Advent means coming into place. We are waiting for Jesus, the Prince of Peace to come into place in our world again, as he did some 2,000 years ago. Both Isaiah and John the Baptist heralded that first coming of Christ.

In the prophet Isaiah's time his people and many future generations had a long wait of 700 years for the first coming of the Prince of Peace. John the Baptist however recognised that Jesus was already present among the people, the very people he urged to be prepared to receive him by being baptised and confessing their sins.

How prepared are we for the second coming of the Prince of Peace? Do we live according to our baptism vows?

- Do we reject the devil and rebellion against God?
- Do we renounce evil and corruption in our world or do we just turn a blind eye?
- Do we repent of wrong doing that separates us from God and our neighbours?
- Do we accept Christ the Prince of Peace, as our Saviour and submit to him?

As for waiting for the Prince of Peace, at present we've all had to work hard on our patience: waiting for jobs to be done, vaccines to be safe enough to administer, people to recover from Covid 19, being able to freely mix with loved ones and friends, being allowed to sing in choirs and churches ... and the list could go on. At present we are all having to become more tolerant in waiting for things to happen or to change. A tough call for a quick fix, instant gratification society. But, are we also prepared for what is happening now?

This run up to Christmas can be a stressful time for people made doubly so by living through a pandemic. There has been and still is fear, anxiety and grief on a massive scale.

We can't understate the horrors of dying with Covid 19, people not being able to be beside their sick relatives and friends, people not allowed to attend the funerals of loved ones, the escalation of domestic abuse, the crashing blow of losing one's job and not being able to pay for essentials, the acute loneliness for those living alone and an increase in depression as people are prevented from interacting with others. Also the fear of not receiving life-saving treatments for those with other serious medical conditions.

Time is a gift from God, so with all this extra time due to lockdown, as we wait for Christ's second coming, how can we be prepared? There is now more time to reflect on our lives and decide what is important and what is less important. Each day I see numerous family groups in my village going for walks or bike rides - on a scale rarely seen pre pandemic.

It has also been a good time to listen to God. To reflect on our blessings when there is so much darkness around us. A time to reflect on our relationship with friends and neighbours nationally and internationally and to show our love for them in a myriad of ways.

As we prepare for the new normal in our lives we need to listen well to God's plan for our lives. Just as families are now making more time for each other we need to do likewise but also make more time for God - time to work, rest, pray and play. Being grounded in prayer keeps us close to God and as St Anselm of Canterbury in the 11th century once said:

"Flee for a while from your tasks, hide yourself for a little space from the turmoil of your thoughts. Come, cast aside your burdensome cares, and put aside your laborious pursuits. For a little while give your time to God, and rest in him for a little while. Enter into the inner chamber of your mind, shut out all things save God and whatever may aid you in seeking God: and having barred the door of your chamber, seek him.'

Advent is about the certain hope that Christ, the Prince of Peace, is coming again

to dwell in us. In today's world there are numerous ways in which we can show our love for our neighbours in Christ and it is through this witness of our lives that the way, the truth and the life can break through the heartache and uncertainty around us and speak joy to our world once more.

Partington is just a few miles away – about 15 minutes in the car. Yet the lives of many people there are very different than the lives of most of us here in High Legh and Little Bollington. Approximately 1/3 of the residents live below the poverty line and it is in the lowest 5% of deprived areas in the UK.

Churches Together in Lymm and District have supported The Hideaway – Hope Centre in Partington during the Covid 19 crisis. They are running a foodbank, providing hot meals daily, hosting a play-centre, giving family advice and counselling. An amazing beacon of hope in that deprived area.

They plan to open a shop selling surplus food and uniform at affordable prices but unfortunately one of the businesses that had offered money is not able to give and they are £3000 short and desperately need to begin this project by December.
