

It was an ordinary August evening and as I'd been sitting at my computer for all of the day, I thought I would do some exercises indoors in the evening (it was already fairly dark). I cleared a space in the living room and it was all going well until I tripped over my feet and went crashing to the floor! I've got a fracture to the top of my arm and a broken leg, which won't be able to bear weight until mid-November. I'm writing this in hospital, but hopefully by the time you read it I will be home or nearly home.

Thank you for your cards, messages and for your prayers, and to those who have 'held the fort' in my absence! I have been very aware that I have been held in prayer which has helped me to feel content with the situation rather than raging against it. I have been inspired by something a nun friend of mine said, when facing a life-changing illness: "but I am content". There is a deep spiritual wisdom in her reaction, and something we need God's grace to reach. There are, of course, many things we should not be content with and maybe part of the wisdom comes in knowing which is which!

I am very grateful for the skill of the paramedics and hospital staff, and their good humour in difficult circumstances. Gratitude is also one of the themes of Harvest which we will be celebrating on Sunday 1st October with a short service at Abbey Leys Farm at 10.15am in the morning and with a service of Holy Communion at St. John's in the evening at 5pm.

At the beginning of November, we then turn from a time for gratefulness to the season of remembering. We will remember the saints who have gone before us and those we know who are no longer with us at the feasts of All Saints and All Souls, and remember those who died in wars on Remembrance Sunday.

The church year ends on a high note with the festival of Christ the King at the end of November. We focus our worship on Christ as King in the Kingdom of God before Advent Sunday when a new church year starts.

I look forward to being back with you again soon,

Message from The Treasurer

I am sure that you have noticed that we have been quiet in recent months regarding the Church's finances. May I take the opportunity of thanking you all for all of your efforts in supporting the Church with your prayer, your time, attending events, your giving and your donations. Since I last communicated we now have Reverend Clare in post and the Vicarage is being used by her.

The Church building is in reasonable order but we have now identified works that we need to complete over the coming twelve months. At this stage we do not have a full costing, but we are aware that some of it can be done from within our own resources whilst some of the more complex work will have to be done by professional contractors.

It's some years since we had a refresh in he Church Room but it is clear that we need to do some redecorating and replacement of the flooring.

The carpet in the aisle in Church has been a priority for being updated for some time, which was deferred, with the advent of the pandemic. We intend to resurrect this project in the coming months.

We have also embarked on developing our Eco Church Strategy. As a result we have replaced the lighting with LEDs and our electricity usage has reduced. Greater stewardship over the use of electrical appliances has also meant that we have made power usage savings. Thanks to Chris Stanisstreet for focussing on the eco matters and achieving a silver award. We will continue with this strategy to do even more and encourage you to do the same

I know that we will not be able to do all of the works identified from within our existing resources but be assured that we will prioritise to make effective use of what we have in the coffers. That said I pray that you will continue to support the Church to enable us to maintain the legacy that has been entrusted into our care
