

Be still, and know that I am God!

(Psalm 46:10)

Summer is upon us! I'm not sure about you, but I have been taken by surprise that suddenly it is August! As I write this the temperatures have been soaring and we are all being warned to take care in the heat. Schools are breaking up and the holiday season is upon us. In the last few months life seems to have gone back to the speed of pre-pandemic times.

The summer holiday season can offer us a time to pause, a time to breathe. There are not very many things that I miss from the time when the pandemic forced so many of us to stop, but one thing I do miss is the stillness and the opportunity to reflect.

In recent months we have all appreciated being able to see friends and family again. I noticed whilst I was on holiday in June that there were many extended family groups on our campsite. I'm sure that we are all grateful that life events including holidays, weddings and other celebrations can once again take place.

Of course, not everyone finds big gatherings or being constantly with others an easy thing, and even for those of us who do enjoy them, we still need some time to ourselves just to be.

But in a busy world, how do we do that?

A person whose life and mission meant he was used to being in the centre of a crowd was Jesus. In many ways he was always surrounded by people – his disciples, his friends, large crowds. We're told in the Bible that the crowds could exceed four or five thousand people. His antidote to this was to 'frequently withdraw to the wilderness to pray' (Luke 5:16). Jesus knew that spending time quietly alone with God was a way to restore and recharge, so that he was able to continue his mission. We have probably all heard in the last couple of years about the restorative power of being out in the natural world. Just going for a walk and noticing nature around us has been shown to be beneficial to our mental as well as our physical well-being.

A lovely place on our doorstep for sitting quietly is in the church grounds at St. John's. Over the years faithful members of the congregation have given time and energy to create a peaceful and beautiful setting. Today, we continue to try and make our grounds an environmentally friendly place for both people and God's creatures such as bees, butterflies, insects and birds. I find taking a few moments to sit and pray very helpful. In my own garden I become too distracted by noticing all that needs doing – weeding being the most pressing!

God's presence is always around us. However, taking a few moments out of a busy day to be still and acknowledge it is very helpful in allowing me to enter back into the rhythm of the day with renewed energy. I hope that, in this holiday season, you too will have an opportunity to 'just be' and to sense God's presence around you.

Psalm 33, one of the Bible readings for August includes these words,
'Our soul waits for the Lord; he is our help and shield. Our heart is glad in him, because we trust in his holy name. Let your steadfast love, O Lord, be upon us, even as we hope in you.'
(Psalm 33: 20-22)

Open the Book and the Hope Journey – understanding parables in June

Lymm and District Churches Together were back again at High Legh Primary School to “Open the Book” on June 21st. The story this time was that of the Prodigal Son – or as Open the Book calls it “The Big Spender”. We start the session with our “Open the Book” song (sung to the tune of Three Blind Mice). The children are getting to know this song well now that we are able to go into school again regularly. Some of the children acted as pigs that the younger son had to look after once his money had run out. Others acted as friends of the younger son, who turned their backs on him once his money had run out. Then everyone joined in singing “If you’re happy and you know it, clap your hands” because the story does have a happy ending with the father and his two sons reunited.



The following morning, a different group from the team took the Reception Year on a “Hope Journey” learning about the meaning of the parable of the Good Samaritan. The morning began with telling the story, followed by a puppet show showing a modern day version of the story. There were plenty of crafts for the children to do whilst they talked about how it felt for those in the stories. Finally, Kevin hobbled in and told them what it had felt like to be the one attacked by robbers and then saved by the Samaritan.



Open The Book—July

On the hottest day of the year on record, the Open the Book team presented the story of Samuel to the pupils at High Legh School. Stewart played the part of the young boy Samuel who keeps getting woken up in the night by a voice, Chris was the long-suffering Eli constantly woken by Samuel wondering what Eli was calling for. Eventually Eli tells Samuel that next time he should simply say “Speak Lord, and I will listen.” And from that day onwards Samuel listened to God and passed his messages to the people of God. Unfortunately they – probably like us – were not as good at listening as Samuel was!

The school broke up for the summer holidays two days later and we wished them all a restful and reviving summer break. We also wish all Year 6 pupils well as they resume their education at secondary school in September.
